Report Summary

The agenda was reviewed and adopted, and the minutes from the previous meeting were approved. A budget update was presented by Miriam highlighting the financial status of various categories including dues, flowers and hospitality, Founders Day, and Sisterhood activities. The committee is within budget for 2025 and has not overspent. Membership touchpoints were discussed, with updates on several members. The meeting focused on updates and coordination regarding the chapter's membership and wellness initiatives. Several members.
